IOWA Advanced Professional Series (APS)

Late 2018, FEMA Advanced Professional Series (APS) program was been turned over to the states training staff to validate and issue APS certificates. States are able to add to the current list of elective courses based on the states environment/structure. The <u>FEMA APS website</u> still lists the initial courses and will provide updates to the course lists as they change/retire.

The APS course list ensures us that you have the ability to perform essential work in a disaster that requires skills in emergency operations and management. These skills may be developed/enhanced through this series of courses that offers "how to" training focused on practical information. This series emphasizes and expands the applied skills in disaster operations, management and coordination.

The majority of the APS courses listed are designed for classroom delivery unless otherwise noted. Please contact lowa training staff if you have questions about the method of instruction. With the current situation with COVID-19, many training consortium partners have transitioned their courses to virtual offerings. However, there are a few courses that are being offered in person, while following the current CDC guidelines. Iowa training staff will work with the hosting site and contracting trainers to assure we keep everyone safe during the trainings.

Iowa **requires all participates seeking an APS Certificate of Completion, to have completed IS 100 (any version), IS 200 (any version), IS 700 (any version), IS 800 (any version), and/or the Professional Development Series (PDS) to have a better understanding of the concepts of the APS courses.

Students will need to complete, from the list below, the **5 required courses** and **any 5 of the 24 elective courses** identified to be eligible to receive the APS Certificate of Completion from Iowa HSEMD Training staff.

Include proof of attendance, either a copy of a certificate or transcript, of each course completed. Please allow 5-10 business days for review process to receive your APS Certificate of Completion via email.
